- SB 0002 Relating to Health Care Services** Haridopolos
Health Care Services; Proposes an amendment to the State Constitution to prohibit laws or rules from compelling any person or employer to purchase, obtain, or otherwise provide for health care coverage; permits a person or an employer to purchase lawful health care services directly from a health care provider; permits a health care provider to accept direct payment from a person or an employer for lawful health care services; etc.
- HB 0003 Relating to Assault or Battery of Law Enforcement Officer** Nehr
Assault or Battery of a Law Enforcement Officer: Requires FDLE to issue blue alert if law enforcement officer has been killed, suffered serious bodily injury, or been assaulted & suspect has fled scene, or if law enforcement officer is missing while in line of duty; requires that blue alert be disseminated on emergency alert system through specified means; provides that emergency traffic information may take precedence over blue alert information. Effective Date: October 1, 2011
- HB 0009 Relating to Supporting the Marketing of Florida Seafood** Rouson
Supporting the Marketing of Florida Seafood: Urges Congress to support marketing of Florida seafood. Effective Date: Not Specified
- HB 0019 Relating to Compensation of County Officials** Mayfield
Compensation of County Officials: Authorizes each county commissioner, circuit court clerk, county comptroller, sheriff, supervisor of elections, property appraiser, & tax collector to reduce his or her salary on voluntary basis. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0039 Relating to Controlled Substances** Adkins
Controlled Substances: Defines term "homologue" for purposes of Florida Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention & Control Act; includes certain hallucinogenic substances on list of controlled substances in Schedule I; provides it is a misdemeanor to be in possession of less than specified amount of certain hallucinogenic substances; provides exception for powdered form of such substances; reenacts provisions to incorporate amendment. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0045 Relating to Regulation of Firearms and Ammunition** Gaetz (M)
Regulation of Firearms and Ammunition: Clarifies & reorganizes provisions that preempt to state entire field of regulation of firearms; prohibits knowing & willful violation of Legislature's occupation of whole field of regulation of firearms & ammunition by enactment or causation of enforcement of any local ordinance or administrative rule or regulation; provides additional intent of section; eliminates provisions authorizing counties to adopt ordinance requiring waiting period between purchase & delivery of handgun; provides penalty for knowing & willful violation of prohibitions; provides for investigation of complaints of violations & prosecution of violators; provides that public funds may not be used to defend unlawful conduct of person charged with knowing & willful violation; provides for termination of employment or contract or removal from office of person acting in official capacity who knowingly & willfully violates section; provides for declaratory & injunctive relief for specified persons or organizations; provides for specified damages & interest; provides for seizure of certain vehicles for specified nonpayment of damages. Effective Date: October 1, 2011
- HB 0059 Relating to Service of Process** Julien
Service of Process: Authorizes sheriff to charge fee for processing writ of execution; authorizes person to provide sheriff with electronic copy of service of process; directs process server to place required information on first page of at least one of processes served; requires process server to list all initial pleadings delivered & served along with process on return-of-service form; requires person issuing process to file return-of-service form with court; grants authorized process servers unannounced access to specified residential areas where defendant or witness resides or is known to be; authorizes person attempting to serve process on registered agent of corporation to serve process, in specified circumstances, on any employee of registered agent during first attempt at service even if registered agent is temporarily absent from his or her office; revises number of copies of process that must be served on statutory agents for certain persons; requires process server to sign return-of-service form; authorizes employee of sheriff to sign return-of-service form electronically; provides that failure to sign return-of-service form invalidates service & subjects process server to fine; reduces number of copies to be served on CFO or assistant as process agent of insurer; provides that records may be retained as paper or electronic copies. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0075 Relating to Offense of Sexting** Abruzzo

Offense of Sexting: Provides that minor commits offense of sexting if he or she knowingly uses computer, or any other device capable of electronic data transmission or distribution, to transmit or distribute to another minor any photograph or video of any person which depicts nudity & is harmful to minors; provides noncriminal & criminal penalties; provides that transmission, distribution, or possession of multiple photographs or videos is single offense if transmission occurs within 24-hour period, etc. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

- SB 0084 Relating to Community Colleges** Lynn
Community Colleges; Renames Gulf Coast Community College as "Gulf Coast State College." Renames Pensacola Junior College as "Pensacola State College." Renames St. Johns River Community College as "St. Johns River State College." Renames Valencia Community College as "Valencia College." Amends provisions relating to linkage institutes, the Florida School of the Arts, and the consolidation of certain training schools. Conforms provisions. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- SB 0088 Relating to Public Employee Compensation** Gaetz (D)
Public Employee Compensation; Revises provisions relating to the prohibition against the payment of extra compensation. Requires contracts that provide for severance pay to include certain provisions after a certain date. Allows for severance pay under specified circumstances. Deletes a provision that allows a municipality to pay extra compensation. Repeals provisions relating to a prohibition against severance pay for officers or employees of water management districts, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 0093 Relating to Security Cameras** Steube
Security Cameras: Reenacts provisions relating to prohibited standards for security cameras; provides for retroactive operation of act; provides exception under specified circumstances. Effective Date: April 27, 2011, and shall operate retroactively to June 1, 2009. If such retroactive application is held by a court of last resort to be unconstitutional, this act shall apply prospectively from the date that this act becomes a law
- HB 0095 Relating to State Parks** Bemby
State Parks: Provides for parents of certain deceased veterans & spouse & parents of law enforcement officers & firefighters who die in line of duty to receive annual entrance passes to state parks at no charge; revises provisions relating to surcharge imposed on admission fees to state parks in areas of critical state concern located in certain counties; provides for certain municipalities to use proceeds of surcharge for land acquisition or beach renourishment or restoration; provides limitations for purposes of determining state matching funds; exempts state from specified liability provisions with respect to parks within state park system that have free-roaming animal populations; designates Jack Mashburn Marina in Bay County; directs DEP to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0097 Relating to Health Insurance** Gaetz (M)
Health Insurance: Prohibits certain health insurance policies & health maintenance contracts from providing coverage for abortions; provides exceptions; defines term "state"; provides that certain restrictions on coverage for abortions apply to certain group health insurance policies issued or delivered outside state which provide coverage to residents of state; provides that certain restrictions on coverage for abortions apply to plans under Employee Health Care Access Act. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0099 Relating to Commercial Insurance Rates** Drake
Commercial Insurance Rates: Exempts additional categories or kinds of insurance & types of commercial lines risks from certain filing requirements; deletes requirement that rate change notice include total premium written for exempt class; removes requirement that specified types of records & information be retained; requires retention of certain actuarial data; requires specified insurers & rating organizations to incur examination expenses; removes requirement that rating organization maintain certain statistics; requires certain actuarial data related to loss cost be retained by rating organization; deletes OIR's authority to require all necessary information to evaluate rate change; expands exemption from certain applicable rate filing requirements to include all commercial motor vehicle insurance; deletes requirement that commercial motor vehicle insurer's rate change notice include total premium written; removes requirement that certain records & information be retained; requires actuarial data relating to commercial motor vehicle insurance be retained; removes requirement that rating organization maintain certain statistics; deletes authority for OIR to require all necessary information from commercial motor vehicle insurer to evaluate rate change. Effective Date: October 1, 2011
- HB 0105 Relating to Open House Parties** Goodson
Open House Parties: Provides that person who violates open house party statute second or subsequent time commits misdemeanor of first degree; provides that person commits misdemeanor of first degree if violation of open house party statute causes or contributes to causing serious bodily injury or death to minor, or causes or contributes to causing serious bodily injury or death to another person as result of

minor's consumption of alcohol or drugs at open house party, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

- HB 0137 Relating to Prostate Cancer Awareness Program** Renuart
Prostate Cancer Awareness Program: Revises structure & objectives of Prostate Cancer Awareness Program; deletes funding qualification for program; authorizes University of Florida Prostate Disease Center to establish prostate cancer advisory council to replace existing advisory committee; provides for membership & duties of advisory council; requires annual report to Governor, Legislature, & State Surgeon General; requires UFPDC & UFPDC Prostate Cancer Advisory Council to be funded within existing resources of UF. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0139 Relating to Child Care Facilities** Ahern
Child Care Facilities: Revises criteria for child care facility, large family child care home, or family day care home to obtain & maintain designation as Gold Seal Quality Care provider; provides for certain household children to be included in calculations regarding capacity of licensed family day care homes & large family child care homes; provides conditions for supervision of household children on premises of family day care homes & large family child care homes; revises advertising requirements applicable to child care facilities. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 0142 Relating to Negligence** Richter
Negligence; Defines the terms "accident," "negligence action," and "products liability action." Requires the trier of fact to consider the fault of all persons who contributed to an accident when apportioning damages in a products liability action alleging an enhanced injury. Requires the jury instructions to apportion certain fault in a products liability action. Provides legislative intent to overrule a judicial opinion. Provides a legislative finding that fault should be apportioned among all responsible persons in a products liability action, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: upon becoming a law
- HB 0143 Relating to Tax Credits** Workman
Tax Credits: Revises priority of tax credits that may be taken against corporate income tax or franchise tax; redefines term "adjusted federal income" to include amount of certain tax credits; authorizes aerospace-sector jobs tax credits & tuition reimbursement tax credits; defines terms; authorizes tax credit to aerospace businesses based on salary or tuition reimbursed to certain employees; specifies maximum annual amount of tax credits for an aerospace business; limits annual amount of tax credits available; prohibits business from claiming aerospace-sector jobs tax credit & tuition reimbursement tax credit, or other state tax credit or tax incentive refund, for same employee; provides for DOR to approve applications for tax credits; prohibits increases in amount of unused tax credits carried over in amended tax returns; provides fines & criminal penalties for certain unlawful claims of tax credits; authorizes DOR to adopt rules; provides for expiration of tax credit program; provides for applicability. Effective Date: January 1, 2012, and applies to tax years beginning on or after that date
- SB 0146 Relating to Criminal Justice** Smith (C)
Criminal Justice; Cites this act as the "Jim King Keep Florida Working Act." Requires state agencies to prepare reports that identify and evaluate restrictions on licensing and employment for ex-offenders. Prohibits state agencies from denying an application for a license, permit, certificate, or employment based solely on a person's lack of civil rights. Provides an exception, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: upon becoming a law, except as otherwise provided
- HB 0155 Relating to Privacy of Firearms Owners** Brodeur
Privacy of Firearm Owners: Provides that licensed practitioner or facility may not record firearm ownership information in patient's medical record; provides exception; provides that unless information is relevant to patient's medical care or safety or safety of others, inquiries regarding firearm ownership or possession should not be made; provides exception for EMTS & paramedics; provides that patient may decline to provide information regarding ownership or possession of firearms; clarifies that physician's authority to choose patients is not altered; prohibits discrimination by licensed practitioners or facilities based solely on patient's firearm ownership or possession; prohibits harassment of patient regarding firearm ownership during examination; prohibits denial of insurance coverage, increased premiums, or other discrimination by insurance companies issuing policies on basis of insured's or applicant's ownership, possession, or storage of firearms or ammunition; clarifies that insurer is not prohibited from considering value of firearms or ammunition in setting personal property premiums; provides for disciplinary action. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- SB 0170 Relating to Electronic Filing and Receipt of Court Documents** Bennett
Electronic Filing and Receipt of Court Documents; Requires each state attorney and public defender to electronically file court documents with the clerk of the court and receive court documents from the clerk of the court. Requires the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association and the Florida Public Defender Association report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by a

specified date on the progress made to use the Florida Courts E-Portal system or the clerks' offices portals to electronically file and receive court documents, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011

- HB 0185 Relating to Relief/Angela Isham/City of Ft. Lauderdale** Mayfield
Relief/Angela Isham/City of Ft. Lauderdale: Provides for relief of Angela Isham by City of Ft. Lauderdale; provides for appropriation to compensate Angela Isham for death of David Isham, which was due to negligence of employees of City of Ft. Lauderdale; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- SB 0218 Relating to Deepwater Horizon Oil Disaster/Penalties** Gaetz (D)
Deepwater Horizon Oil Disaster/Penalties; Urges the Congress of the United States to dedicate penalties collected from parties responsible for the Deepwater Horizon oil disaster to repairing the environmental and economic damage caused by the disaster.
- SB 0224 Relating to Local Government Accountability** Dean
Local Government Accountability; Amends provisions relating to the Legislative Auditing Committee to clarify when the Department of Community Affairs may institute procedures for declaring that a special district is inactive. Specifies the level of detail required for each fund in the sheriff's proposed budget. Authorizes certain municipalities to levy and collect special assessments to fund special security and crime prevention services and facilities, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: October 1, 2011
- HB 0227 Relating to Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot** Brandes
Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot: Authorizes absent uniformed services voters & overseas voters to use federal write-in absentee ballot to vote in any federal & certain state or local elections, under certain circumstances; prescribes requirements for designating candidate choices; provides for disposition of valid votes involving joint candidacies; allows for abbreviations, misspellings, & other minor variations in name of office, candidate, or political party; authorizes submission of multiple ballots under certain circumstances; details circumstances under which votes in federal, state, & local races on federal write-in absentee ballot will be canvassed; establishes certain canvassing procedures for federal write-in absentee ballots; directs Department of State to adopt rules to determine what constitutes valid vote on federal write-in absentee ballot; provides restrictions; provides minimum requirements; conforms provisions to changes made by act. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 0228 Relating to Code of Student Conduct** Siplin
Code of Student Conduct; Requires the district school board to include in the code of student conduct adopted by the board an explanation of the responsibilities of each student with regard to appropriate dress and respect for self and others and the role that appropriate dress and respect for self and others has on an orderly learning environment, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 0229 Relating to City of Tampa, Hillsborough County** Young
City of Tampa, Hillsborough County: Revises General Employees' Pension Plan for city; revises definitions of terms "Salaries or Wages," "Employee," & "Military Service Time"; revises application of term "Actuarial Equivalent"; defines term "Limitation Year"; provides that all employee contributions to pension fund after certain date are mandatory & that city shall pay such contributions to fund on behalf of employee; provides certain beneficiaries option to roll over certain death benefits; provides for refund of employee contributions; revises provision that addresses reemployment of retired employees; revises construction of act; allows DROP members annual election to elect investment option, as determined by board of trustees, to be applied to participant's account for plan year entering DROP program & for each subsequent plan year; revises benefit limitations; revises requirements for distribution of benefits; provides default distribution when member fails to elect distribution option; revises direct rollover options; revises terms "eligible rollover distribution," "eligible rollover plan," & "distributee." Effective Date: October 1, 2011
- HB 0231 Relating to City Pension Fund for Firefighters and Police Officers in the City of Tampa, Hillsborough County** Young
City Pension Fund for Firefighters and Police Officers in the City of Tampa, Hillsborough County: Authorizes City of Tampa to enter into supplemental contract with certain firefighters & police officers to comply with ch. 2009-97, Laws of Florida; revises manner in which elective trustees are elected; increases maximum length of time prior to term commencement in which to conduct trustee elections; allows board to retain services of more than one nationally recognized professional investment counselor; increases investment cap on foreign securities; provides that investment cap on foreign securities is measured on market value basis & may not be revised, amended, increased, or repealed except as provided by general law; allows retired members to elect to receive reduced retirement benefit in order to provide surviving spouse benefit under certain circumstances; allows members to purchase up to an additional 5 years of credited service based upon prior service as full-time certified firefighter or certified police officer or for military service in U.S. Armed Forces subject to certain conditions; allows DROP participants upon

entering DROP & annually thereafter to elect option for accruing annual interest at low-risk variable rate selected annually by board in lieu of rate reflecting fund's net investment performance as determined by board; prohibits members from selecting certain pension contract changes & rejecting others; confirms in part City of Tampa Firefighters & Police Officers Pension Contract; provides severability. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

- HB 0233 Relating to City of Tampa, Hillsborough County** Young
City of Tampa, Hillsborough County: Authorizes Division of Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco of DBPR to issue alcoholic beverage license to City of Tampa to use within Curtis Hixon Waterfront Park & Kiley Garden Park; provides that license may be used only for special events; provides for payment of license fee; prohibits sales for consumption off premises; authorizes transfer & provides for subsequent reversion of license under certain circumstances. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- SB 0234 Relating to Firearms** Evers
Firearms; Provides that a person who is licensed to carry a concealed firearm is not in violation of law if the firearm is briefly and openly displayed under certain circumstances. Allows the Division of Licensing of the DOACS to take fingerprints from concealed carry license applicants. Provides that a person may not openly carry a weapon or firearm or carry a concealed weapon or firearm into specified locations. Provides that concealed carry licensees shall not be prohibited from carrying or storing a firearm in a vehicle for lawful purposes, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: upon becoming a law
- SB 0240 Relating to Violations of Injunctions for Protection** Joyner
Violations of Injunctions for Protection; Adds circumstances that violate an injunction for protection against repeat violence, sexual violence, or dating violence. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 0251 Relating to Sexual Offenses** Dorworth
Sexual Offenses: Cites act as "Walk in Their Shoes Act"; permits admission of evidence of defendant's commission of other crimes, wrongs, or acts of sexual nature in criminal case in which defendant is charged with crime of sexual nature; revises offenses considered "child molestation" for such purposes; authorizes use of service or therapy animals in courts hearing sexual offense cases under certain circumstances; requires property or material constituting child pornography used in criminal proceeding to remain in care, custody, & control of state attorney or court; prohibits reproduction of such property or material by defendant when specified criteria are met by state attorney; permits access by defendant; requires emergency room to arrange for gathering of forensic medical evidence from victims who desire evidence for possible future report of sexual battery; requires law enforcement officer to provide or arrange for transportation of victim of sexual violence to facility for medical treatment or forensic examination; provides for review of officer's final report by victim & opportunity for statement; provides for prosecution for video voyeurism within 1 year after victim of video voyeurism obtains actual knowledge of recording or recording is confiscated by law enforcement agency; requires additional court cost in cases of certain criminal offenses to be deposited into Rape Crisis Program Trust Fund; provides for hepatitis testing of persons charged with certain offenses; requires that public schools provide health education addressing Internet safety; prohibits controlling or intentionally viewing any photograph, motion picture, exhibition, show, image, data, computer depiction, representation, or other presentation that includes sexual conduct by child; provides exception & penalties, & conforms provisions of offense severity ranking chart of Criminal Punishment Code. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0253 Relating to Limited Liability Companies** Stargel
Limited Liability Companies: Provides that charging order against member's limited liability interest is sole & exclusive remedy available to enforce judgment creditor's unsatisfied judgment against member or member's assignee with respect to limited liability company; provides exception for enforcing judgment creditor's unsatisfied judgment against judgment debtor or assignee of judgment debtor of single-member limited liability company under certain circumstances; provides that, in case of multimember limited liability company, certain remedies are unavailable to judgment creditor attempting to satisfy judgment; prohibits court from ordering such remedies; provides construction relating to secured creditor rights, specified principles of law and equity, and continuing enforcement jurisdiction of court; provides legislative intent; provides for retroactive application. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0277 Relating to Sovereign Immunity** Goodson
Sovereign Immunity: Requires that claim in wrongful death case be presented to DFS within 2 years after claim accrues; provides that failure of DFS or appropriate agency to make final disposition within 90 days after filing is deemed to be final denial of claim; tolls statute of limitations for time taken by DFS or other agency to deny medical malpractice or wrongful death claim; provides that actions for wrongful death against state or one of its agencies or subdivisions must be brought within period applicable to actions brought against other defendants; provides for application to actions accruing on or after effective date. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, and applies to causes of action accruing on or after that date

- HB 0279 Relating to Certification of Child Welfare Personnel** Davis
Training and Certification of Child Welfare Personnel: Provides required criteria for approval of credentialing entities that develop & administer certification programs for persons who provide child welfare services; revises use of Child Welfare Training Trust Fund within DCFS; requires persons who provide child welfare services to be certified by third-party credentialing entity; allows entities to add to or augment preservice curriculum & allows entities to contract for training; provides for recognition for currently certified persons; authorizes approval of third-party credentialing entities. Effective Date: October 1, 2011
- HB 0281 Relating to Value Adjustment Boards** Logan
Value Adjustment Boards: Requires petitioner challenging assessed value of property before value adjustment board to pay specified percentage of taxes by certain date; requires petitioner challenging denial of classification or exemption, or assessment on specified grounds, before value adjustment board to pay amount of tax which taxpayer admits in good faith to be owing by certain date; provides for penalty if good faith payment is grossly disproportionate to amount of tax found to be due & taxpayer's admission was not made in good faith; requires board to deny petition in writing by certain date if required amount of taxes is not timely paid; requires payment of interest on certain unpaid taxes; requires payment of interest on certain overpayments of taxes; provides for discount for ad valorem taxes paid within 30 days after mailing of corrected tax notice resulting from action of value adjustment board when corrected tax notice is issued before taxes become delinquent. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, and shall apply to petitions filed with value adjustment boards on or after July 1, 2011
- HB 0283 Relating to Seaports** Young
Seaports: Includes representative of Port Citrus as member of Florida Seaport Transportation & Economic Development Council; provides that Citrus County may apply for grant for feasibility study through Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Council; provides for evaluation; requires DOT to include study in budget request under certain circumstances; terminates membership of Port Citrus on council under certain circumstances; deletes provisions relating to statewide minimum standards for seaport security; deletes authorization to exempt all or part of seaport from specified requirements; revises provisions relating to seaport security plans; revises requirements for certain secure or restricted areas; revises provisions relating to when part of seaport may temporarily be designated as secure or restricted area; deletes provisions requiring FDLE to administer statewide seaport access eligibility reporting system; deletes provisions requiring that persons seeking authorization to access secure & restricted areas of seaport execute affidavit; prohibits seaport from charging any fee for administration or production of access control credentials associated with fingerprint-based background check, in addition to fee for federal TWIC; provides exceptions; provides for seaport-specific access credentials; deletes provisions requiring fingerprint-based criminal history checks; deletes authority for waivers from security requirements in certain circumstances; deletes provisions relating to inspections, reporting requirements, & allocation of appropriated funds for security project needs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0287 Relating to Economic Development** Eisnaugle
Economic Development: Revises definitions of terms "new business" & "expansion of an existing business"; provides for average wage of new job; provides eligibility for target industry businesses; authorizes board of county commissioners of charter county to call & hold referendum to determine whether to grant economic development ad valorem tax exemptions if in receipt of petition or initiative signed by percentage of electors as required by county charter; revises language of ballot questions relating to authority to grant economic development tax exemptions; specifies additional information that must be included in written application requesting adoption of ordinance granting economic development ad valorem tax exemption; specifies factors for board of county commissioners or governing authority of municipality to consider when deciding whether to approve or reject applications for economic development tax exemptions; limits allowable duration of economic development tax exemption granted by county or municipal ordinance; authorizes written tax exemption agreements consistent with act upon approval of tax exemption; specifies reporting requirements; authorizes revocation of agreement; limits application of act to certain exemptions granted pursuant to referenda held on or after act's effective date. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, and shall apply only to exemptions from ad valorem taxation granted pursuant to referenda held on or after July 1, 2011, under the provisions of s. 196.1995(1), Florida Statutes
- SB 0298 Relating to Municipal Governing Body Meetings** Alexander
Municipal Governing Body Meetings; Authorizes the governing bodies of certain municipalities to hold meetings within specified boundaries. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 0311 Relating to Local Business Taxes** Roberson

- HB 0331 Relating to Firesafety** Weinstein

- SB 0484 Relating to Discriminatory Taxes/Reinsurance** Hays
Discriminatory Taxes/Reinsurance; Urges Congress to oppose any effort to impose new discriminatory taxes that would significantly limit the use of reinsurance provided by companies located outside the United States.
- HB 0501 Relating to Choose Life License Plates** Baxley

Indian River Mosquito Control District, Indian River County: Revises powers of board of commissioners relating to employment of certain persons; specifies provisions of law governing election of commissioners & removes obsolete provisions for staggering of initial terms; requires district to pay for surety bonds required of commissioners before they assume office; requires commissioners to elect secretary/treasurer for board; revises per diem & travel expense provisions for commissioners & employees; revises powers of board relating to control of mosquitoes & sandflies & deletes power of board to eliminate all species of mosquitoes & sandflies in district; revises provisions relating to board's purchasing, borrowing, &

- HB 0557 Relating to Parental Rights Amendment** Coley

- HB 0563 Relating to Injunctions for Protection Against Domestic Violence, Repeat Violence, Sexual Violence, or Dating Violence** Jones (M)
Injunctions for Protection Against Domestic Violence, Repeat Violence, Sexual Violence, or Dating Violence: Directs Florida Association of Court Clerks & Comptrollers, subject to available funding, to develop automated process by which petitioner for injunction for protection may request notification of service of injunction or notice of other court actions related to injunction; requires that notice be given to petitioner within specified time; provides for content of notice; authorizes association to apply for grants to fund development of automated process. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0567 Relating to Judgment Interest** Hudson
Judgment Interest: Requires annual adjustments to rate of interest payable on judgments; provides exceptions; revises calculation of interest rate. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0579 Relating to Pub. Rec./Regional Autism Centers** Coley
Pub. Coral Springs Medical Center; provides for appropriation to compensate them for injuries sustained as result of negligence of Coral Springs Medical Center; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- SB 0618 Relating to Juvenile Justice** Evers

- HB 0629 Relating to Relief/Estate of Cesar Solomon/JTA** McBurney
Relief/Estate of Cesar Solomon/JTA: Provides for relief of Estate of Cesar Solomon by Jacksonville Transportation Authority; provides for appropriation to compensate estate for Mr. Solomon's death, which resulted from negligence of JTA; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0639 Relating to Affordable Housing** Aubuchon
Affordable Housing: Provides housing finance authority with additional purpose for which it may exercise power to borrow; revises provisions relating to local comprehensive plans to authorize inclusion of element for affordable housing for certain seniors; provides for disposition of real property by local government for certain purposes; revises allocation of certain proceeds distributed from excise tax on documents that are paid into State Treasury to credit of State Housing Trust Fund; includes needs of persons with special needs in state housing strategy's periodic review & report; authorizes DCA Secretary to designate senior-level agency employee to serve on board of directors of FHFC; provides for appointment of inspector general of FHFC; requires certain rates of interest to be made available to sponsors of projects for persons with special needs; provides & revises powers of FHFC; limits reservation of funds within each notice of fund availability to persons with special needs tenant group; includes persons with special needs as tenant group for specified purposes of State Apartment Incentive Loan Program; revises & provides criteria to be used by specified review committee for competitive ranking of applications for such program; prohibits funds from State Housing Trust Fund or Local Government Housing Trust Fund that are appropriated for specified programs from being used for certain purposes. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 0650 Relating to Mobile Home Park Lot Tenancies** Jones (D)
Mobile Home Park Lot Tenancies; Provides for local code and ordinance violations to be cited to the responsible party. Prohibits liens, penalties, fines, or other administrative or civil proceedings against one party or that party's property for a duty or responsibility of the other party. Revises procedures for mobile home owners being provided eviction notice due to a change in use of the land comprising the mobile home park or the portion thereof from which mobile homes are to be evicted, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: upon becoming a law
- SB 0652 Relating to Liability of Spaceflight Entities** Simmons
Liability of Spaceflight Entities; Revises the definition of the term "spaceflight entity" to include certain manufacturers and suppliers for purposes of specified provisions for immunity from liability. Saves a provision from future repeal which provides spaceflight entities with immunity from liability for the loss, damage, or death of a participant resulting from the inherent risks of spaceflight activities. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 0657 Relating to Martin County** Harrell

- SB 0664 Relating to Missing Person Investigations/Silver Alert** Benacquisto

Effective Date: October 1, 2011
- SB 0670 Relating to Powers of Attorney** Joyner
Powers of Attorney; Provides for a durable power of attorney. Specifies the qualifications for an agent. Provides requirements for the execution of a power of attorney. Provides for the validity of powers of attorney created by a certain date or in another jurisdiction. Provides for the validity of a military power of attorney. Provides for the validity of a photocopy or electronic copy of a power of attorney. Provides for the meaning and effectiveness of a power of attorney, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: October 1, 2011
- HB 0677 Relating to Pub. Rec./Office of Financial Regulation** Pilon
Pub. Rec./Office of Financial Regulation: Provides exemption from public records requirements for information held by OFR that is received from another state or federal regulatory, administrative, or criminal justice agency & is otherwise confidential or exempt pursuant to laws of that state or pursuant to federal law; provides exemption from public records requirements for information held by OFR that is received or developed by OFR as part of joint or multiagency examination or investigation with another state or federal regulatory, administrative, or criminal justice agency; specifies conditions under which OFR may obtain & use such information; provides for retroactive application; provides for future review & repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0689 Relating to Driver Education and Testing** Berman
Driver Education and Testing: Requires curricula of driver improvement courses & traffic law & substance abuse education courses to include instruction on risks associated with using handheld electronic communication device while operating motor vehicle; provides requirements for driver's license examination questions pertaining to traffic regulations relating to blind pedestrians; provides for written examination for learner's driver's license to be available from third-party providers, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0699 Relating to Southeast Volusia Hospital District, Volusia County** Taylor
Southeast Volusia Hospital District, Volusia County: Expands representation of district's governing body. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0701 Relating to Property Rights** Eisnaugle
Property Rights: Shortens notice period for certain actions; revises procedures for determining governmental entity's final decision identifying allowable uses for property; defines what constitutes first application of law or regulation; clarifies waiver of sovereign immunity for liability; provides for prospective application. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 0702 Relating to Umbilical Cord Blood Banking** Flores
Umbilical Cord Blood Banking; Requires the Department of Health to post on its website certain resources and a website link to specified materials regarding umbilical cord blood banking. Requires the department to encourage certain health care providers to make available to their pregnant patients information related to umbilical cord blood banking. Provides that a health care provider or health care facility and its employees or agents are not liable for damages in a civil action, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- SB 0722 Relating to Saving Dogs** Norman

- HB 0723 Relating to Extraterritorial Reciprocity in Workers' Compensation Claims** Weinstein

Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0745 Relating to Polk County Historical Commission, Polk County** Wood
 Polk County Historical Commission, Polk County: Revises number of commissioners; provides for membership, meetings, rules of procedure, & staff; provides powers & duties; provides for funding & dedicated accounts for county historical museum & genealogical library; deletes provisions relating to Polk County Historical Association; requires board of county commissioners to provide repository for museum & library materials. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0767 Relating to Local Government** Rooney, Jr.
 Local Government: Authorizes board of county commissioners to negotiate lease of certain real property for limited period; authorizes transfers of right-of-way between local governments by deed. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 0782 Relating to Fallen Officers Memorial/Road Designations** Latvala
 Fallen Officers Memorial/Road Designations; Designates the Sgt. Thomas J. Baitinger, Officer Jeffrey A. Yaslowitz, and Officer David S. Crawford Memorial Highway in Pinellas County. Designates the Officer Jeffrey A. Kocob and Officer David J. Curtis Memorial Highway in Hillsborough County. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 0797 Relating to Interscholastic and Intrascholastic Sports** Perry
 Interscholastic and Intrascholastic Sports: Removes provisions relating to pilot program in which middle school student or high school student in private school may participate in athletics at public school; provides for statewide implementation of program; requires maintenance of records of participating students; limits participation in program to students who are enrolled in non-FHSAA member private schools consisting of maximum number of students. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0811 Relating to Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation** Perry
 Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation: Revises provisions for distribution of specified funds received from civil penalties for traffic infractions; directs funds to be transmitted monthly by DOR directly to foundation; removes provisions for investment by SBA; directs liquid balances of such funds held by SBA to be remitted to foundation. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0843 Relating to Teaching Agency for Home and Community-Based Care** Diaz
 Teaching Agency for Home and Community-Based Care: Authorizes DEA to designate home health agency as teaching agency for home & community-based care; establishes criteria for qualification; authorizes teaching agency to be affiliated with academic research university that meets certain criteria & academic health center. - SB 0844 Relating to Violations/Probation/Community Control/Widman Act** Benacquisto

- HB 0861 Relating to North Springs Improvement District, Broward County** Jenne
North Springs Improvement District, Broward County: Extends & enlarges boundaries of district. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0865 Relating to Town of Southwest Ranches, Broward County** Jenne
Town of Southwest Ranches, Broward County: Amends town's charter to remove inapplicable provisions & make ministerial changes; provides further description of town's rural residential character; eliminates previously repealed language; provides additional language relating to filling council vacancies; clarifies that only town council is required to vote by roll call; clarifies that roll call vote is required by town council on all land use & quasi-judicial items. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0869 Relating to Manatee County Port Authority** Boyd
Manatee County Port Authority: Provides for conveyance of title to submerged lands adjacent to port authority's boundaries from Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement Trust Fund; defines territorial boundaries of submerged lands. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0879 Relating to Targeted Economic Development** Eisnaugle

- HB 0883 Relating to Public Lodging Establishments and Public Food Service Establishments** Horner
Public Lodging Establishments and Public Food Service Establishments: Excludes nonprofit organizations providing certain housing from definition of "public lodging establishment"; prohibits local governments from regulating, restricting, or prohibiting vacation rentals based solely on their classification, use, or occupancy; revises authority preempted to state with regard to regulation of public lodging establishments & public food service establishments; provides that public lodging establishments formerly classified as resort condominiums & resort dwellings are classified as vacation rentals; revises penalties for establishments operating without valid license; provides additional penalties for offense of unlawfully distributing handbills in public lodging establishment; specifies that certain items used in committing offense are subject to seizure & forfeiture; authorizes law enforcement officer to give notice to appear to person without warrant in certain circumstances; provides that specified provisions do not affect or impede

- HB 0887 Relating to Communications Services Tax** Dorworth
Communications Services Tax: Requires that dealer compute communications services tax based on rounding algorithm; provides criteria; provides for application of tax; provides options to dealer for applying rounding algorithm; authorizes dealer to apply rounding algorithm to aggregate tax amount under certain conditions; provides that dealer is not required to collect tax based on bracket system; removes provision requiring DOR to make available tax amounts & applicable brackets; provides that provisions of act are remedial in nature & apply retroactively; provides that act does not provide basis for assessment of tax not paid or create right to certain refunds or credits. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 0898 Relating to Executive Office of the Governor** Bennett
Executive Office of the Governor; Abrogates the repeal of provisions governing the Florida Faith-based and Community-based Advisory Council. Requires the Office of State-Federal Relations to submit an annual report to the Governor and Legislature detailing its budget, personnel, and activities. EFFECTIVE DATE: upon becoming a law
- HB 0901 Relating to Household Moving Services** Horner
Household Moving Services: Provides for biennial renewal of mover & moving broker registrations; authorizes DOACS to extend registration expiration dates in order to establish staggered dates; requires calculation of biennial registration fees based on annual rate; deletes provision requiring certain movers & moving brokers to obtain local license or registration & pay state registration fee; prohibits mover or moving broker from conducting business without being registered with DOACS; preempts local ordinances & regulations except in certain counties; restricts levy or collection of local registration fees & taxes of movers & moving brokers; provides for local registration & bonding; exempts local business taxes from preemption; provides for retroactive application. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0913 Relating to Public Records/Records Held by Public Airports** Horner
Pub. Rec./Records Held by Public Airports: Provides exemption from public records requirements for proprietary confidential business information & trade secrets held by public airport & for any proposal or counterproposal exchanged between public airport & nongovernmental entity relating to sale, use, development, or lease of airport facilities; provides for expiration of exemptions & review & repeal thereof; provides finding of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 0916 Relating to Official Florida Statutes** Thrasher
Official Florida Statutes; Adopts the Florida Statutes 2011 and designates the portions thereof that are to constitute the official law of the state. Provides that the Florida Statutes 2011 shall be effective immediately upon publication. Provides that general laws enacted during the 2010 regular session and prior thereto and not included in the Florida Statutes 2011 are repealed. Provides that general laws enacted during the November 16, 2010, special session and the 2011 regular session are not repealed by this adoption act. EFFECTIVE DATE: 60 days after sine die
- SB 0924 Relating to Florida Statutes** Thrasher
Florida Statutes; Deletes provisions which have become inoperative by noncurrent repeal or expiration and, pursuant to provisions, may be omitted from the 2011 Florida Statutes only through a reviser's bill duly enacted by the Legislature. Conforms cross-references. EFFECTIVE DATE: 60 days after sine die
- SB 0926 Relating to Liability/Employers of Developmentally Disabled** Storms
Liability/Employers of Developmentally Disabled; Provides that an employer, under certain circumstances, is not liable for the acts or omissions of an employee who is a person with a developmental disability. Provides that a supported employment service provider that provides or has provided supported employment services to a person with a developmental disability is not liable for the actions or conduct of the person occurring within the scope of the person's employment. Defines the terms "developmental disability" and "supported employment service provider." Provides for application of the act. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 0935 Relating to Health Care Price Transparency** Corcoran
Health Care Price Transparency: Authorizes primary care provider to publish & post schedule of certain charges for medical services offered to patients; requires schedule to include certain information regarding medical services offered; provides that schedule may group provider's services by price levels & list services in each price level; provides exemption from license fee & continuing education requirements for provider who posts schedule of charges; requires primary care provider's estimates of charges for medical services to be consistent with posted schedule; requires provider to post schedule of charges for certain time period; provides for repayment of license fees & compliance with continuing education requirements previously waived if schedule of charges was not posted; requires urgent care centers to publish & post

- SB 0946 Relating to Florida Statutes** Thrasher
Florida Statutes; Amends provisions to conform to the directive in section 21 of chapter 2010-70, Laws of Florida, to prepare a reviser's bill for consideration by the 2011 Regular Session of the Legislature to substitute the term "Florida College System Institution" for the terms "Florida college," "community college," and "junior college" where those terms appear in the Florida K-20 Education Code. EFFECTIVE DATE: 60 days after sine die
- HB 0949 Relating to Pest Control** Smith (J)
Pest Control: Provides rule changes that allow operators to provide certain emergency notice to DOACS by facsimile or electronic means; increases minimum bodily injury & property damage insurance coverage required for pest control businesses; provides for licensure by DOACS of pest control customer contact centers; provides application requirements; provides for fees, licensure renewal, penalties, & licensure expiration; provides for certification of commercial wildlife trappers; provides certification requirements, examination requirements, & fees; limits scope of work permitted by certificateholders; clarifies that licensees & certificateholders who practice accepted pest control methods are immune from liability for violating laws prohibiting cruelty to animals; increases minimum financial responsibility requirements for licensees that perform certain inspections. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0951 Relating to Recording of Real Property Documents** Albritton
Recording of Real Property Documents: Establishes that real property electronic documents accepted for recordation are validly recorded; provides legislative intent; provides for prospective & retroactive application. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- SB 0958 Relating to State Revenue Limitation** Budget Subcommittee on Finance and Tax
State Revenue Limitation; Proposes amendments to the State Constitution to replace the existing state revenue limitation with a new state revenue limitation based on inflation and population changes.
- SB 0960 Relating to Liquefied Petroleum Gas** Bennett
Liquefied Petroleum Gas; Prohibits the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and other state agencies from requiring compliance with certain national standards for liquefied petroleum gas tanks unless the department or agencies require compliance with a specified edition of the national standards. Provides for future expiration of such requirements. Revises the term "propane" for purposes of the Florida Propane Gas Education, Safety, and Research Act, to incorporate changes to certain national standards in a reference thereto. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 0965 Relating to Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program** Horner
Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program: Revises provisions relating to amount of tax credit allowed for contribution made to eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization; revises provisions relating to carryforward of unused amount of tax credit & rescindment of all or part of tax credit under Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 0985 Relating to Hillsborough County** Burgin
Hillsborough County: Defers future repeal of ch. 2004-414, Laws of Florida, which relates to projects for which payment & performance bonds may be waived for construction of public building, for prosecution & completion of public work, or for repairs on public building or public work when cost of project is at or below certain threshold & contract for construction, completion, or repair is awarded pursuant to economic development program established to encourage local small businesses to participate in county procurement programs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 0993 Relating to Rulemaking** Roberson
Rulemaking; (THIS BILL COMBINES CS/CS/H 993 & H 7239) Requires that agency include in its notice of intended rulemaking statement whether proposed rule will require legislative ratification; provides for withdrawal of adopted rule that is not ratified by Legislature; clarifies that certain proposed rules are effective only when ratified by Legislature; reduces time before agency files rule for adoption within which agency must notify person who submitted lower cost alternative & Administrative Procedures Committee;

excludes rules adopting federal standards & emergency rulemaking from certain provisions; reduces time in which substantially affected person may seek administrative determination of invalidity of rule after statement or revised statement of estimated regulatory costs is available; provides for agency reporting of certain annual regulatory plans; requires that agency complete enhanced biennial review of its existing rules; requires report; provides for future review & repeal; provides that Legislature may establish & maintain Internet-based public survey of regulatory impacts; provides certain immunities; provides exemptions from legislative ratification; provides that nonapplicant who petitions to challenge agency's issuance of license, permit, or conceptual approval in certain circumstances has burden of ultimate persuasion & burden of going forward with evidence. - HB 0997 Relating to Juvenile Civil Citations** Pilon

- HB 1063 Relating to Canaveral Port District, Brevard County** Goodson
Canaveral Port District, Brevard County: Increases amount for which Canaveral Port Authority may encumber personal properties & facilities; increases amount for which contracts for construction, improvement, repair, or building may be entered into or goods, supplies, or materials may be purchased by district or authority. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 1085 Relating to Women's Health** Plakon
Women's Health: Creates "Kelly Smith Gynecologic & Ovarian Cancer Education & Awareness Act"; requires DOH to disseminate & display information about gynecologic cancers; requires department to encourage women to discuss risks of gynecologic cancers with their health care providers; requires State Surgeon General to post link to gynecologic cancer information on CDC Internet website; encourages DOH to seek any available funds to promote gynecologic cancer awareness; encourages DOH to collaborate with other entities to create systematic approach to increasing public awareness regarding gynecologic cancers; increases membership of Florida Cancer Control & Research Advisory Council. - HB 1087 Relating to Insurance** Holder
Insurance: Authorizes payment of workers' compensation benefits on prepaid card under certain circumstances; revises dates applicable to calculations of annual assessments upon certain workers' compensation insurers relating to special disability trust fund; provides exemption from having to obtain certificate of authority to insurers that cover only nonresidents of U.S. under certain conditions; requires funds collected for insurer to be held in bank insured by FDIC, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 1111 Relating to Family Law** Mayfield

- HB 1127 Relating to Abortions** Porter
Abortions: Requires that ultrasound be performed on woman obtaining abortion; requires that ultrasound be reviewed with patient before woman gives informed consent for abortion procedure; requires that woman certify in writing that she declined to review ultrasound & did so of her own free will & without undue influence; provides exemption from requirement to view ultrasound for women who are victims of rape, incest, domestic violence, or human trafficking or for women who have serious medical condition necessitating abortion; provides grounds for disciplinary action for failure to comply with such

- SB 1128 Relating to Public Retirement Plans** Ring
Public Retirement Plans; Provides for the calculation of local government retirement benefits after a certain date. Requires that the property appraiser add certain information related to the adverse possession claim to the parcel information on the tax roll and prescribing conditions for removal of that information. Excludes property subject to adverse possession claims without color of title from provisions authorizing the tax collector not to send a tax notice for minimum tax bills, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 1163 Relating to Ad Valorem Taxation** Dorworth
Ad Valorem Taxation: Reduces amount that any change in value of nonhomestead residential property resulting from annual reassessment may exceed assessed value of property for prior year; reduces amount that any change in value of certain residential & nonresidential real property resulting from annual reassessment may exceed assessed value of property for prior year; provides first-time Florida homesteader with additional homestead exemption; provides for calculation of exemption; provides for applicability period of exemption; provides for annual reduction in exemption during applicability period; provides application procedures; provides for applicability of specified provisions; provides for contingent effect of provisions & varying dates of application depending on adoption & adoption date of specified joint resolutions; authorizes DOR to adopt emergency rules; provides for application & renewal of emergency rules; requires Legislature to consider appropriating funds to fiscally constrained counties to offset reductions in ad valorem tax revenue as result of implementation of certain revisions to State Constitution; requires application to DOR to participate in distribution of such appropriation; provides for certain contingent effect & retroactive application. - HB 1165 Relating to Driver's Licenses and Identification Cards** Holder
Driver's Licenses and Identification Cards: Provides for person's status as veteran to be indicated on his or her driver's license or identification upon payment of additional fee & presentation of person's Form DD 214. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 1179 Relating to Abortion/Public Funding/Construction of Rights** Baxley
Abortion/Public Funding/Construction of Rights; Proposes creation of s. 28, Art. I of State Constitution; prohibits public funding of abortions; provides exceptions; prohibits State Constitution from being interpreted to create broader rights to abortion than those contained in U.S. Constitution. Effective Date: Not Specified
- HB 1193 Relating to Health Insurance** Hudson
Health Insurance: Prohibits person from being compelled to purchase health insurance except under specified conditions; specifies that act does not prohibit collection of certain debts. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

- HB 1195 Relating to Condominium, Cooperative, and Homeowners' Associations** Moraitis, Jr.
Condominium, Cooperative, and Homeowners' Associations: Revises & provides various provisions relating to specified condominium, cooperative, & homeowners' associations, including records, elections, fees, powers, duties, officers, meetings, notices, governance, foreclosure, liens, & bulk assignees & bulk buyers. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 1196 Relating to Construction Liens** Bogdanoff
Construction Liens; Specifies that a lessor's interest in property is not subject to a construction lien for improvements made by a lessee if certain documents containing specific information and meeting certain criteria are recorded in the official records of the county before the recording of a notice of commencement. Authorizes certain contractors and lienors to demand that a lessor serve verified copies of a lease prohibiting liability for improvements made by a lessee, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: October 1, 2011
- SB 1202 Relating to Joint Rules of the Legislature** Thrasher
Joint Rules of the Legislature; Establishes the Joint Rules of the Florida Legislature for the 2010-2012 term.
- SB 1204 Relating to Joint Legislative Organizations** Thrasher
Joint Legislative Organizations; Repeals provisions relating to the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability, the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee, the Legislative Committee on Intergovernmental Relations, the Joint Legislative Committee on Everglades Oversight, and the Florida Government Accountability Act. Repeal provisions relating to creation of a joint select committee to review the findings and recommendations of the Century Commission for a Sustainable Florida for potential action, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: May 5, 2011
- HB 1231 Relating to Telecommunications** Horner
Telecommunications: Creates "Regulatory Reform Act"; revises & repeals provisions relating to Public Service Commission & telecommunication companies, facilities, & services; requires commission to initiate rulemaking to reduce regulatory assessment fee for telecommunications companies & produce annual report describing its efforts to do so. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- HB 1247 Relating to Parental Notice of Abortion** Stargel
Parental Notice of Abortion: Revises definition of term "constructive notice"; revises notice requirements relating to termination of pregnancy of minor; provides exceptions to notice requirements; revises procedure for judicial waiver of notice; provides for minor to petition for hearing within specified time; provides that in hearing relating to waiving requirement for parental notice, court consider certain additional factors, including whether minor's decision to terminate her pregnancy was due to undue influence; provides procedure for appeal if judicial waiver of notice is not granted; requires that court order contain factual findings & legal conclusions; requires Supreme Court reports to Governor & Legislature to include additional information; provides for severability. Effective Date: October 1, 2011, or upon the adoption of rules and forms pursuant to s. 390.01114(5), Florida Statutes, by the Supreme Court for purposes of the amendment of s. 390.01114, Florida Statutes, by this act, whichever occurs earlier.
- HB 1255 Relating to Education Accountability** Adkins
Education Accountability: Revises numerous provisions relating to K-12 public education system; revises provisions relating to virtual instruction courses, school board member acceptance of gifts, Opportunity Scholarship Program, McKay Scholarships, Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program, special education services, requirements for middle grades promotion & high school graduation, digital curriculum, career & professional academies, use of restraint & seclusion on students with disabilities, assistive technology, statewide assessments, college readiness, school improvement, designation of school grades, education budgets, funding for exceptional student education, & teacher qualifications. Effective Date: July 1, 2011
- SB 1292 Relating to Chief Financial Officer** Alexander
Chief Financial Officer; Requires the Chief Financial Officer to conduct workshops with state agencies, local governments, educational entities, and entities of higher education to gather information pertaining to uniform reporting requirements. Requires the Chief Financial Officer to accept comments from state agencies, local governments, educational entities, entities of higher education, and interested parties regarding proposed charts of account by a certain date, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- HB 1293 Relating to Brevard County** Tobia
Brevard County: Authorizes Division of Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco of Department of Business & Professional Regulation to issue an alcoholic beverage license to Brevard Art Museum, Inc., for use within museum's buildings; requires payment of license fee; provides for sale of beverages for consumption at museum; provides for transfer of license. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

- HB 1307 Relating to City of Mount Dora, Lake County** Metz
 City of Mount Dora, Lake County: Authorizes Division of Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco of DBPR to issue temporary permits to nonprofit civic organization to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on premises at outdoor events on public right-of-way in downtown Mount Dora, subject to certain statutory requirements; provides that such events require street-closure permit from city; provides that permits authorized by act are in addition to certain other authorized temporary permits; requires division to adopt rules. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- HB 1311 Relating to Walton County** Coley
 Walton County: Provides that certain rigid coastal armoring structures constructed during specified time may remain without need to obtain DEP permit; provides conditions. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
- SB 1312 Relating to School Nutrition Programs** Siplin
 School Nutrition Programs; Cites this act as the "Healthy Schools for Healthy Lives Act." - SB 2094 Relating to State Employees** Budget

State Financial Information; Requires the Auditor General to annually provide to the Legislature a list of school districts and water management districts that have failed to comply with certain financial transparency requirements, as identified pursuant to audit. - SB 2098 Relating to Consolidation/State Information Technology Services** Budget

- SB 2110 Relating to Auditor General** Budget

Revises the duties of the Auditor General with respect to responsibilities for auditing certain reports made to the State Supreme Court and the operations of the Florida Clerks of Court Operations Corporation, respectively. Revises requirements to issue rules for surplus property, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- SB 2112 Relating to Juvenile Detention Facilities** Budget

- SB 2122 Relating to State Government Operations** Budget
State Government Operations; Removes the Division of Dairy Industry within the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Changes the name of the Division of Forestry to the Florida Forest Service. Requires the Department of Legal Affairs, rather than the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, to distribute free of charge a motor vehicle consumer's rights pamphlet. Provides for the state attorneys and the Department of Legal Affairs, rather than the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, to enforce the law prohibiting price gouging, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: upon becoming a law
- SB 2128 Relating to Public Employees Relations Commission** Budget

Public Employees Relations Commission; Requires that the commission be composed of a chair and two part-time members rather than two full-time members. Provides for the chair of the commission to remain as a full-time appointment. Prohibits the part-time members from engaging in any business, vocation, or employment that conflicts with their duties while in such office. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011

- SB 2130 Relating to Pollution Control** Budget
Pollution Control; Revises requirements for the deposit of funds used in providing financial assistance for water pollution control. Requires that such funds be deposited into the department's Federal Grants Trust Fund rather than the department's Grants and Donations Trust Fund. Specifies additional uses of moneys deposited into the Federal Grants Trust Fund. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- SB 2132 Relating to Department of Financial Services** Budget
Department of Financial Services; Repeals provisions relating to the Chief Financial Officer's authorization to operate a personal check-cashing service or a remote financial service unit at the capitol and to employ additional persons to assist in performing such services. Abolishes appropriations from the General Revenue Fund to pay the salaries of the additional employees. Revises the duties of the Division of Consumer Services. Revises the criteria for premiums charged to agencies and departments for purposes of the State Risk Management Trust Fund, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- SB 2136 Relating to Federal Grants Trust Fund/DBPR** Budget
Federal Grants Trust Fund/DBPR; Creates the Federal Grants Trust Fund within the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. Provides for the purpose of the trust fund and sources of funds. - SB 2142 Relating to Water Management Districts** Budget

- SB 2144 Relating to Medicaid** Budget
Medicaid; Provides for funding the Medicaid reimbursement for certain persons age 65 or older while the optional program is being phased out. Renames the "medically needy" program as the "Medicaid nonpoverty medical subsidy." Limits certain categories of persons eligible for the subsidy to only physician services after a certain date. - SB 2146 Relating to Department of Children and Family Services** Budget

- SB 2156 Relating to Governmental Reorganization** Budget

Transfers the Office of Workforce Services to Jobs Florida. Transfers the functions and trust funds of the Department of Community Affairs to other agencies. Transfers the Florida Housing Finance Corporation to Jobs Florida, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2011
- SB 2160 Relating to Department Of Highway Safety And Motor Vehicles** Budget
Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Requires the department rather than the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue special motor vehicle license plates. - SB 2230 Relating to Extension of 2011 Legislative Session** Thrasher
